Kindness School

- We began our journey to be a credited Kindness school in 2020. Kindness
 is part of our school culture and one of our six character values.
- As Ofsted commented kindness is at the heart of everything we do in school.
- Weekly Kindness club we run a weekly lunchtime kindness club where children make small crafts to hang on our kindness trees in the assembly hall.
- We deliver the crafts as random acts of kindness in our community.

Kindness Elves

- The story of The Kindness Elves this is shared with classes at the beginning of each school year
- Elf garden kindness pebble jars are available for children to add a pebble if they are noticed being kind. Notes are also left for children to find.
- Kindness missions challenges are often left in the elf garden for children to complete i.e. remember your manners at lunchtime today or remember to hold a door for others today





Daily Kindness Notes

- Staff are always looking out for examples of kindness in classes. Parents are also invited to share examples of their children showing kindness at home too. The 'elves' then leave special kindness notes for the children to find.
- We celebrate our kindness super stars by awarding a kindness sticker and with a celebratory song.

- Links with our local Care home. We regularly meet our friends from our local care home.
 Each class has a penpal they write to regularly.
- We have arranged sing a long sessions, craft sessions, afternoon tea and even a walk to raise funds for Alzheimer's UK as part of Dementia awareness week.
