As a values based school we have worked intensively to promote all of our school values throughout our teaching, our play and our engagement with others – and kindness to others has been a huge focus for all of our staff and children.

As a school we are really looking forward to World Kindness Day 2018 and the staff have already been working hard to create a pool of ideas that can be used on the day.

With the help of the school council, I have been listening to Children's ideas about Kindness and delivered these to teachers to inform planning and our values assemblies.

Here is a list of some of the Kind things that we have been doing in school this year!

- We have promoted kindness through our weekly values awards.
- We have introduced Values Ambassadors throughout both key stages to promote kindness to their peers throughout lessons and recreational times.
- We have had kindness at the core of aspects of our curriculum – with a real focus coming through during our PSHE lessons.
- Participated in a school link project to improve relations between children from different areas within the town.
- We raised over £1000 for Cancer Research UK by hosting our very own Race for Life in school.
- Raised money for a range of different charities through in school events
- Collected donations as part of our Harvest Celebration, these were given to the local food bank and the assisted living charity in the local community – We also won an award for having the most donations within the town!
- Had local community volunteers into visit to talk about helping people in the local community.
- We have celebrated all faiths across our town and held an inclusive 'Faith Leaders Assembly' where children learnt extensively about different faiths and each leader described what kindness meant to them.
- Promoted anti-bullying week.
- Set up a community project with the local Elderly Residents Care Home to help combat loneliness for their residents and our children. We work on a bi-weekly basis offering art activities, tea and cake.




School Values Ambassadors at the Luton Foodbank after delivering our Harvest collection ready for distribution to individuals and families in need.
